Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure for Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(North Knoxville) Road Closure- East Inskip Road [October 20] – KUB contract crews will close a short section of East Inskip Road, between Cedar Lane and Henrietta Drive, from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Thursday, October 20, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Alternate routes include Cedar Lane, Henrietta Drive, Charles Drive, and Montrose Road. Local traffic access to driveways will be maintained, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(North Knoxville) Fenwood Drive Road Closure [October 20 & 21] – KUB contract crews will close a short section of Fenwood Drive, between Montrose Road and Aster Road, daily from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., Thursday, October 20, and Friday, October 21, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. All lanes will reopen to traffic outside of listed work hours. Alternate routes include Montrose Road, Aster Road, and Cedar Lane. Local traffic access to driveways will be maintained, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(West Knoxville) Kingston Pike Lane Closure [October 20] – KUB contract crews will close a short section of the curbside, westbound lane of Kingston Pike, between Alcoa Highway and South Concord Street, from 9 a.m. – noon, on Wednesday, October 20, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Traffic flow in all directions will be maintained, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
