(North Knoxville) East Inskip Road Alternating Lane Closures [January 25] – KUB contract crews will reduce a section of East Inskip Road to one alternating lane of traffic, between Cedar Lane and Henrietta Drive, from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Wednesday, January 25, as concrete restoration work is performed in the area. Lane closures will alternate between the northbound lane and the southbound lane as work progresses. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(North Knoxville) Westchester Drive Road Closure [January 25- February 8] – KUB contract crews will close Westchester Drive, between Lynette Road and Mac-Alice Drive, daily, Monday- Friday, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., starting Wednesday, January 25, and lasting through Wednesday, February 8, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. All lanes will reopen to traffic outside of listed work hours. Alternate routes include Lynette Road and Mac-Alice Drive. Local traffic access to driveways will be maintained, and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
