Re: Traffic Advisory – Lane/Road Closure for Utility Work [All closures and work are weather permitting]

(North Knoxville) Fair Drive Road Closure [April 5-7] – KUB contract crews will close a short section of Fair Drive between Inskip Road and Heins Road to traffic daily from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., starting Wednesday, April 5, through Friday, April 7, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Alternate routes include Cedar Lane, Montrose Road, Charles Drive, and Inskip Road. Appropriate signage will be on site, and access to area driveways will be maintained.

(North Knoxville) Inskip Road Alternating Lane Closures [April 5-7] – KUB contract crews will reduce a section of Inskip Road to one alternating lane of traffic, between Cedar Lane and Henrietta Drive, daily from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., starting on Wednesday, April 5, and lasting through Friday, April 7, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Lane closures will alternate between the northbound lane and the southbound lane as work progresses. All lanes will reopen to traffic outside of listed work hours. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(West Knoxville) S. Northshore Drive Intermittent Lane Closures [April 5-7] – Beginning on Wednesday, April 5, and lasting through Friday, April 7, KUB crews will implement intermittent single lane closures at the following locations on S. Northshore Drive in order to perform work on the electric distribution system:

- **S. Northshore Drive at Branton Boulevard**
- **S. Northshore Drive at Knightsbridge Drive**
- **S. Northshore Drive at Queensbridge Drive**

Work will occur between the hours of 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., and lane closures will not occur at every location at the same time. All lanes will reopen outside of listed work hours. Flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control, and local traffic access to driveways will be maintained.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
