Re: Traffic Advisory - Lane/Road Closure for Utility Work [All closures and work are

weather permitting]

(West Knoxville) Division Street Lane Shift [October 25] – KUB contract crews will implement a lane shift on Division Street between Sutherland Avenue and Cary Street from 9 a.m. – noon, Tuesday, October 25, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Westbound traffic flow will be directed through the work zone with the assistance of flaggers and channeling devices. Follow-up advisories will be issued as necessary.

(West Knoxville) Kingston Pike Lane Closure [October 25] – KUB crews will close a short section of the curbside, westbound lane of Kingston Pike, between S. Mohican Street and Cemetery Road, from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., on Tuesday, October 25, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. One westbound lane, the center turn lane, and both eastbound lanes will remain open during this time. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(West Knoxville) Middlebrook Pike Lane Closure [October 25] – KUB contract crews will close a short section of the inside, eastbound lane of Middlebrook Pike at its intersection with Lake Brook Boulevard from noon – 3 p.m., on Tuesday, October 25, as work is performed on the water distribution system in the area. Traffic flow in all directions will be maintained, as will turn access from Middlebrook Pike to Lake Brook Boulevard. Flaggers and signs will be on site to assist with traffic control.

(West Knoxville) Wesley Road Lane Closure [October 25] – KUB crews will reduce a section of Wesley Road to one alternating lane of traffic, at its intersection with Kinzalow Drive, from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m., on Tuesday, October 25, as work is performed on the wastewater collection system in the area. Traffic flow in all directions will be maintained, and flaggers will be on site to assist with traffic control. Wednesday, October 26, and Thursday, October 27, will be used as rain dates if necessary.

Some listed closures may extend beyond the scheduled times depending on the conditions encountered during excavation and construction. Appropriate traffic control measures will be in place at each location to assist motorists traveling in these areas. Due to the ongoing presence of workers and equipment, motorists are advised to use caution and expect temporary delays in these areas. Tennessee's **Move Over Law** requires motorists approaching a utility vehicle with flashing lights to move over if safe to do so, creating an empty lane buffer. When changing lanes is not possible, motorists must reduce speed.
